
The Berard Team helped the Port of Fernandina Florida increase its capacity and attract more cargo ship traffic by delivering these two massive STS cranes. The cranes were side loaded onto a special purpose deck barge at the Port of Wilmington, North Carolina. The team lifted the cranes from the rail and rotated them 90 degrees to begin the loading process. Once the cranes were on the barge, they were again rotated in place then moved into position for sea fastening. After a 350 mile Atlantic transit, the cranes were again rotated in place to position for offload onto the dock. Berard utilized a series of loading ramps to reinforce a section of the dock as the load was moved to position for rotation and travel to the final rail location. The Berard team performed flawlessly and made this another one of our many STS crane delivery success stories!

The Berard team recently transported this 190,000 lb. vessel from the Port of New Orleans to a Baton Rouge area refinery. Grossing 285,000 pounds and qualifying as a superload was no problem to permit using the using a 9 axle Faymonville HighwayMAX trailer and 4 axle Peterbilt tractor. Once arrived at the destination, Berard crews were waiting with a 400 ton gantry to lift from the truck to ground. The entire loading, transport, and offloading process was complete within 1 day.







The Berard team and the community came together to help our brother Trey Chapman, who was diagnosed with cancer early last year. Trey was one of our over-the-road transport team members, but he was more like a brother to us. A benefit was being planned to help with medical expenses when covid came along and the event had to be canceled. Sadly, our brother Trey passed away.
