126 axle lines of SPMTs, 12 power packs and steel plating Berard has served major shipyards around the United States for decades, with several that are commissioned to build our nation's most technologically advanced naval assets. Our team is well versed in naval vessel transports and we're the heavy transport provider shipyards rely on. This is one such project in Panama City, Florida where the team transported this massive 3,500-ton OPC 915 named Argus from the client's fabrication area to the launch system for launching at a later date. A total of 126 axle lines of SPMTs were situated in a transverse configuration that allowed them to be driven between the launch system support beams. The team first lifted the 361' L x 55'W vessel and began the 200' trip, then moved south onto the launch system. The team also moved a second OPC to make room for the yard to commence construction of another vessel. Berard is proud to have been involved in our nation's greatest naval projects. 6 and 8 axle line Goldhofer PST/SLE transporters, hydraulic jacking systems, skid systems, barge ramps, ballast pumps and winch trucks The Berard team had the honor of spending a week at the National WWII Museum in New Orleans, LA transporting various artifacts around the campus. The crew first moved a Landing Vehicle Tracked (LVT) using hydraulic jacks and a low profile skid system, and a Landing Craft Personnel Large (LCPL) using hydraulic jacks and a 6 axle Goldhofer PST/SLE transporter to within the Louisiana Memorial Pavilion. The team also transported the Patrol Torpedo boat 305 (PT-305) from outdoor storage at Seabrook Harbor to within the museum campus for future display. The boat was rolled onto a deck barge provided by Canal Barge at Port Cargo Services, barged to the Mississippi River, transferred via crane and spreader-bar rigging provided by Stewart Construction and Versabar respectively to the 8 axle line transporter, then moved by Berard via congested city streets to the museum. Once on the museum campus PT-305 was driven into the Kushner Restoration Pavilion and set to the building floor using hydraulic jacks. Berard appreciates the opportunity to transport these priceless artifacts for future generations to enjoy for years to come.
