# Over Land & Sea Compressor Skid Transport



## Job Specs

### Weight:

Compressor skid: 230,000 lbs.

Separator skid: 240,000 lbs.

### Dimensions:

48'-9"L x 25'-2"W x 20'-5"H

### Equipment Used:

12 axle line Goldhofer PST-SLE transporters, 16 axle line Faymonville ModulMAX platform trailer, prime movers, ramps and ballast pumps

The Berard team successfully handled the transportation of a 230,000-pound compressor skid from a fabricator in New Iberia, LA, and a 240,000-pound separator skid from Freeport, TX, to the Port of Houston, TX, for export. The compressor skid was first jacked and weighed at the fabricator's site before being transported approximately one mile to the barge loading dock, where it was rolled onto the barge and securely lashed. In Freeport, TX, the separator skid was self-loaded using 16 lines of hydraulic platform trailer, then transported 10 miles to the Port of Freeport and loaded onto the same barge. Both units were safely delivered to the Port of Houston for transfer to an ocean vessel.

The Berard team successfully managed the transportation of four vessels from multiple fabricators to a chemical plant in Southeast Texas. The largest vessel weighed 180,000 pounds, and the tallest stood over 15 feet high. Berard's engineers and managers meticulously developed a transport plan and identified the optimal routing to the site. Thanks to their expertise, all four vessels were delivered safely and on schedule, contributing to the timely progress of the site's construction.





# It's Cold Out There! Winter Driving Tips



Winter driving is dangerous and can be difficult, so it's important to be prepared and drive carefully. Here are some tips for driving safely in winter weather:

- > **Slow down.** Reduce your speed to account for lower traction on snow and ice. It takes longer to stop on icy roads, so increase your following distance.
- > **Be smooth.** Apply the gas and brake slowly, and be smooth with the steering wheel.
- > **Maintain control.** Don't panic, and try to stay in control of your vehicle.
- > **Use your brakes correctly.** Keep your heel on the floor and use the ball of your foot to apply steady pressure on the brake pedal.
