

In an earlier issue of OnTheMove we featured a massive floodgate loadout and installation. This month features another set of floodgates that the Berard Team took on in Delcambre Louisiana for the same massive flood protection project in New Orleans. The two gates were transported to the waterfront and loaded out onto an ocean going deck barge for final delivery and installation at the construction site.

The Team used 24 axle lines of ESE SPMT's to move each 560 ton gate and steel plating had to be set for the transporters to travel on due to the soft ground conditions. Thanks to all the Team members who helped make this a great move!

Looking somewhat like a hotel on wheels, the Berard Team transported this 1455 ton living quarters in Pascagoula Mississippi from the fabrication area to a dockside location for loading onto a Jumbo ship for the remainder of it's journey. The move consisted of some tight maneuvering to pass the load alongside a nearby power station. The team then used a set of barge ramps to cross the 100' x 65', four story high structure over a set of crane tracks to avoid damaging the rails.
