

Spotlight On Safety

It's Hot Out There!



How about that heat!

With summer time in full swing the temps have really been high and that means staying hydrated. The Berard Team practices proper hydration on every job and keeps plenty of water and other drinks at the ready to prevent dehydration or worse — heat stroke.

What makes heatstroke severe and potentially lifethreatening is that the body's normal mechanisms for dealing with heat stress, such as sweating and temperature control, become inadequate. The main sign of heatstroke is a markedly elevated body temperature — generally greater than 104 F (40 C) — with changes in mental status ranging from personality changes to confusion and coma. Skin may be hot and dry — although if heatstroke is caused by exertion, the skin may be moist.

Symptoms of Heat Stroke

The hallmark symptom of heat stroke is a core body temperature above 105 degrees. But fainting may be the first sign.

Other symptoms may include:

- > Throbbing headache
- Dizziness and light-headedness
- > Lack of sweating despite the heat
- > Red, hot, and dry skin
- > Muscle weakness or cramps
- > Nausea and vomiting
- > Rapid heartbeat, which may be either strong or weak
- > Rapid, shallow breathing
- > Behavioral changes i.e. confusion, disorientation or staggering
- > Seizures
- Unconsciousness
