

The Berard Team is proud to once again take part in the future of our armed forces. The team loaded out another 2,157 joint high speed vessel, (JHSV) named the Millinocket, in Mobile, Alabama. On day one of the project, the team transported the JHSV from the client's final assembly bay to a deck barge. Once secured on the barge, it traveled down river to be transloaded the next day. Day two brought the transloading of the JHSV onto the Alabama, an 800' floating drydock. As usual, the transload went smoothly thanks to all involved through all the hard work and dedication to getting the job done safely and successfully by our dedicated team members!

Equipment Used: 24 axlelines of SLE's, loading ramps & high volume water pumps.

The Berard Team recently tackled a job in the great state of Georgia that involved transporting some 340T machine components from port to site which involved an over the road transport and a heavy transport from a barge discharge site. The challenges were a nine foot tide variance which limited roll off times and local curfew to accommodate work and school traffic. The team used twelve axle double wide configurations to haul the heavy components and twelve axle single wide for the smaller components. The route did not come without challenges as there were three culverts that had to be bridged to avoid any compromise of the structures. Berard met the challenge and performed the project on time and without injury or incident. Another job complete and another success for the team!
