

Weight: 3,129 Tons

290' L x 64' W x 62' H

Equipment Used:

96 axle lines of SLE spmts, 52 axle lines of ESE spmts, 8 power packs. The Berard Team played a part in the construction of the first and second liquid natural gas powered offshore supply vessels to exist in the United States. The team transported the massive 3,129 ton, 290' long vessel from the client's fabrication facility using a total of one hundred and forty-eight axle lines of self propelled modular transporters powered by eight power packs. The project began with the assembling of the spmts and positioning them into a four file configuration for maximum weight distribution. Once all systems were ready, the team lifted the vessel off of its supports and began its slow and steady trip onto the client's syncro-lift. After in position, the team lowered the vessel and spmts were removed so the vessel could be lowered into the water and on to the next phases of it's construction.

Equipment Used:

24 axle lines of ESE spmts, barge ramps, winch trucks and steel plating

Forrest Gump was nowhere to be found in Bayou La Batre, Alabama, but what the Berard Team did find was this 616 ton tugboat. The team first had to position the spmts perpendicular to the tug to lift it off of its supports stands, then reconfigure the supports so the spmts could then be reset in a normal parallel configuration. Once set, the team rotated it 180 degrees in a very tight space to line up for the final move onto the barge which was furnished by our sister company, Berard Marine. Now with the tug safely on the barge, it could then be transported to another facility to be offloaded via crane for final outfitting. The Berard Team members once again did a great job resulting in another success and a very happy client!
