# On The Road North Dakota Bound!

Weight: 130,000 lbs.

## **Dimensions:**

90'-4"L x 17'-7"H x 13'-6"W

### **Equipment Used:**

Nine axle extendable dropdeck trailer, bucket trucks & escorts Berard recently transported this electrical building from Houston, TX to Killdeer, ND using a nine axle extendable drop-deck. Berard provided turnkey service to the client for this project by arranging all permits, escorts, and bucket trucks as needed for the 2,146 mile journey. The trip was completed in six days, which was right on schedule.



# Power Up! Transformer Installation



**Job Specs** 

Weight: 200,000 lbs. each

# **Equipment Used:**

6 axle SPMT, unified jacking systems, jacks, and 300 ton skid system

Berard was tasked with delivering four 100 ton transformers from rail to pad in Arkansas. Using a 300 ton skid system and 6 axle line SPMT, the team carefully offloaded the transformers from the railcars onto the SPMT. They were then transported to the site and were skidded off of the SPMT and lowered onto each of the pads. All four units were safely installed in only 4 days. Our team did a great job and we thank them for all their hard work and making this project another success story!







# On The Road Wide Load!

5 @ 50,000 lbs. each

**Dimensions:** 

21'L x 20'W x 16' - 3"H

### **Equipment Used:**

50 ton lowboys, prime movers, bucket trucks, and escorts

When these 20' wide crated skids needed to head out to the port for export, Berard tackled the challenge. Berard performed detailed route surveys from Lafayette, LA to the Port of New Orleans, LA and the Port of Houston, TX to ensure the cargo could be moved. The Port of Houston was selected, and Berard went to work obtaining all permits and permissions. Night movement and wrong-way travel on certain roadways was required to reach the final destination. Berard transported a total of 8 loads of various sizes to complete the project.

It's a daunting task of keeping track of the thousands of pieces of equipment and inventory that Berard owns. Anthony knows where each piece of equipment is at any given time as he stays on top of his game each and every day.
