The team transported the EPF from the client's final assembly building to a deck barge. Once secured on the barge, it traveled down river to be trans-loaded. Once at the transfer point, the trans-loading of the EPF onto the Alabama, an 800' floating dry dock, began. As usual, the trans-load went smoothly thanks to all involved. Through hard work and dedication, the job was completed safely and successfully.


The heat is on and with it comes the dangers of heat exhaustion and heat stroke. Keep cool and hydrated while out on the job this summer.

Heat Exhaustion

Heat exhaustion is the body's response to loss of water and salt from profuse sweating. Signs include headache, nausea, dizziness, weakness, irritability, thirst, and heavy sweating.

Heat Stroke

The most serious form of heat-related illness, heat stroke happens when the body becomes unable to regulate its core temperature. Sweating stops and the body can no longer rid itself of excess heat. Signs include confusion, loss of consciousness, and seizures. Heat stroke is a medical emergency that may result in death! Call 911 immediately.
