

The Berard team recently helped an oil & gas company recycle an offshore platform package from the Gulf of Mexico. The package consisted of the main deck/topside superstructure and the jacket support structure. The pieces were loaded onto a deck barge offshore for shipment to a South Louisiana fabricator that would refurbish the package. The Berard team went to work and devised the best possible method to offload the package from the barge to the fabrication area where the refurbish work will commence. The deck weighing in at 1,033 tons was the first to be offloaded using 42 axle lines of SPMTs. The team rolled the deck off of the barge then rotated it 90 degrees clockwise and moved it into position in the yard. The process was repeated with the jacket structure the next week. The team was successful in helping the client achieve the first phase of getting their investment closer to productivity.



Berard got the call to deliver a 300,000 lb. vessel to a plant near Baton Rouge, LA. The destination plant being on the Mississippi River was thought to be an easy barge delivery and roll-off solution. However, Berard notified of potential high water levels at the time of shipment. Berard submitted a plan barging the vessel to an off-river, water level controlled roll-off site, rolling off, then trucking the cargo over 90 miles to the destination. The cargo was delivered on schedule despite record Mississippi River levels. Once delivered the cargo was self-offloaded onto stands.


